

In an effort to reduce weight and improve fuel economy, automakers continue to eliminate spare tires from new vehicles. According to new research from AAA, nearly one-third (28%) of 2017 model year vehicles do not come with a spare tire as standard equipment, creating an unnecessary hassle and expense for drivers. Last year alone, AAA came to the rescue to

faced with a flat tire whose cars did not have a spare tire. To avoid a roadside surprise, AAA urges drivers to check their trunk for a spare tire before trouble strikes.

"Having a flat tire can be a nuisance for drivers, but not having a spare could put them in an even more aggravating situation," said John Nielsen, AAA's managing director of Automotive Engineering and of the top reasons why mem-

Even if drivers do have a spare tire, they are often reaching for their cell phones to call for roadside assistance rather than changing the tire themselves. According to a previous AAA survey, nearly 20% (39 million) of U.S. drivers do not know how to change a flat tire.

As a replacement for a spare tire, some automakers are including tire-inflator

kits that can temporarily repair small punctures in flat tires. However, a 2015 AAA study found that tire-inflator kits have limited functionality and cannot provide even a temporary fix for many tirerelated problems, including sidewall damage or blowouts. Not only are tire-inflator kits not a good substitute for a spare tire, they can cost up to 10 times more than a tire repair and have a shelf life of

only four to eight years.

"With low-profile tires and the elimination of a spare tire, many newer vehicles are especially vulnerable to roadside tire trouble," Nielsen said. "AAA urges drivers to make it a priority to check their vehicle's equipment and know what to do if faced with a flat tire."

a flat tire, AAA offers these precautionary tips:

Do not assume there's a spare. When purchasing a new vehicle, always ask for a detailed list of equipment and whether a spare tire can

be purchased.

Nixon made the now-famous declaration during a televised question-and-answer session with Associated Press editors. Nixon, who appeared "tense" to a New York Times reporter, was auestioned about his role in the Watergate burglary scandal and efforts to cover up the fact that members of his reelection committee had funded the breakin. Nixon replied "people have got to know whether or not their President is a crook, Well, I'm not a crook. I've earned everything I've got." He did, however, admit that he was at fault for failing to supervise his campaign's fund-raisina activities.

At one point during the discussion, Nixon gave a morbid response to an unrelated question about why he chose not to fly with back-up to Air Force One when traveling, the usual security protocol for presidential flights. He told the crowd that by taking just one aircraft he was saving energy, money, process: "if this one (plane) goes down," he said, "they don't have to impeach (me)."

Volunteer tax preparers needed to help elderly and low income residents file income taxes

The United Way of Porter near the April 15 deadline." County is seeking volunteers to help elderly, moderate-tolow income Porter County residents file their federal and state income taxes for the 2017 tax year.

If you ever wonder how to make a difference and help people in your comvolunteer may be just right for you. The IRS is looking for people who will provide free tax help in 2017 through a program called Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA).

You will receive all the tax training you need so you can help others file their tax return. IRS printed materials are supplied include a volunteer resource guide used both in training and certification, and later with the clients.

For the second year, the IRS is using the online version of "TaxSlayer" a program that may be familiar to taxpayers who currently prepare their own taxes.

According to local VITA site coordinator, George Kuebler, at the United Way of Porter County, "previous tax preparation experience, while useful, is not as prerequisite to do the program. The training materials guide the volunteers through tax law and instructions in how to you the TaxSlayer program."

"Training a can be accomplished the volunteers own rate, leading them to the required certification to participate in the program," Kuebler added. "Volunteers can decide how much time they want to contribute during the tax preparation season that usually starts about February 1 and concludes



"Some retiree volunteers take time off for vacation during this period, and resume their participation when they get back," he added. "There are no too few hours, and the number of hours are up to the volunteer."

The online training begins munity, then becoming a tax in mid-November at which time the printed materials will be available to assist in the course completion.

Volunteer hours are flex*ible*. Volunteers generally serve an average of three to five hours per week. The United Way of Porter County program is usually open from late-January through the tax filing deadline in April.

gram uses federal funds to offer \$3,125 per semester or \$2,083 per trimester for up to five years of post-secondary civil engineering education. 
