## **Robotic lung surgery arrives at Franciscan Health Crown Point**

Robotic lung surgery, a minimally invasive technique that has advantages over traditional surgical methods, is now benefiting patients at Franciscan Health Crown

Thoracic surgery specialist Jason Fitzgerald, MD, began performing lung procedures in June 2021 using the da Vinci Xi surgical system from Intuitive Surgical, Inc. Many of the surgeries he's done have been on cancer patients. "You can do more complex procedures with smaller incisions, so they recover faster and have less pain," Dr. Fitzgerald said.

Traditional open surgery requires the surgeon to make a large incision in the chest and then spread the ribs to see

the lung directly. "It's pretty painful and there's more blood loss," Dr. Fitzgerald said. Video-assisted thoracoscopic surgery (VATS) is less invasive, using smaller incisions to insert a camera

and surgical instruments. However, Dr. Fitzgerald said the instruments in VATS are limited in their mobility and the visualization is just twodimensional.

The da Vinci technology

has multiple arms and a highdefinition 3D camera that are inserted through small incisions. The operator sits at a control console next to the bed in the operating room and controls the movement

of the robot.

"Basically, you're looking through a camera inside the patient. It's 3D and has a huge amount of detail, much more than you can get on a (See Robotic Pg. 8)

The Women's Diagnostic Centers of Community Healthcare System also offer 3D mammography with same-day appointments and, in most cases, same-day results. The centers have earned national accreditations for breast imaging, mammography, stereotactic breast biopsy, breast ultrasound and ultrasound guided breast biopsy.

"Our strongest weapon against breast cancer is early detection," said Mary Nicholson, MD, medical director of Community Hospital Women's Diagnostic Center in Munster and regional direcfor Community Healthcare breast cancer.

System. "By offering ABUS in addition to mammography for patients with dense breast tissue, we anticipate improving detection for small cancers that may not be seen on a mammogram alone in these women."

Some women are more likely to have dense breasts, such as those who are premenopausal; use postmenopausal hormone replacement therapy (HRT); OR have a lower body mass index (BMI).

Women less likely to have dense breasts are those who have gone through menopause; have had children; or use the hormonal therapy tamoxifen, either to lower

inhibitors, Aromatase which are another type of hormonal therapy, may also decrease breast density, but the impact doesn't appear to be as substantial

Only a mammogram can show whether a patient has dense breasts. The American Cancer Society recommends that women receive yearly mammograms beginning at age 40. Women who have been informed they have dense breast tissue should talk with their doctor about their risk and consider additional screening. Contact your insurance company about coverage for an ABUS screening.

#### **Purdue North iwest receiv** ) for TRIO Edu al Talent Search

Purdue University Northwest's TRIO program was awarded renewed grants from the U.S. Department of Education for its federally funded Educational Talent Search programs to continue serving first-generation and economically disadvantaged college students.

The pre-college programs provide counseling, aptitude assessment, career exploration, financial assistance information, college visits, college application help and more at the Hammond and Westville campuses. The program coordinators service students in Lake, La Porte, Porter, and Starke counties.

The new five-year grant cycle through August 2026 awarded around \$2 million for Hammond and \$1.8 million for Westville. The grants are increased from \$1.2 million and \$1.5 million, respectively, in the previous cycle.

"This level of support and resources is unparalleled," Maceo Rainey, TRIO Director of Talent Search, said. "Most communities don't have a TRIO program. It's a huge advantage for taxpayers in Northwest Indiana. In communities like Lake, Porter, La Porte, and Starke counties, 80% of the residents do not have a four-year bachelor's degree. TRIO is helping to close that gap."

The Educational Talent Search teams' focus in the new grant cycle includes supporting workforce development by shaping gradua tion pathways with intervention resources, industry role model matches, and skills inventories.

PNW's Educational Talent Search programs are two of five federally funded TRIO programs. The others include Upward Bound, Student Support Services, and the McNair Achievement Program. Student Support Services received \$1.7 million in 2020 for its current five-year cycle.





### Sixty-five police officers earn Phoenix Award for stopping overdoses with Narcan

Substance Abuse Council (PCSAC) and the Council's Drunk Driving Task Force recently presented 65 police officers from various Porter County jurisdictions with the Phoenix Award for the use of Narcan to save lives during drug overdose events.

Chuck Harris, former Porter County coroner, found it fitting to establish the Phoenix Award specifically for first responders that were able to successfully curtail overdoses with Narcan when the opioid epidemic was beginning to rapidly unfold over five years

"As coroner, you see the ultimate results of the overdose, after the fact," said Harris. "By the time I arrived on a scene, the first responders had worked on the victim to revive them from the overdose without success."

In 2021, there was an increase in opioid deaths due to fentanyl and multiple doses of Narcan are required to revive the victim. Indiana reported a 32% increase in fatal overdoses during a 12-month period ending in April 2021, according to the CDC. As of last week in December 2021, Porter County reported 36 overdose deaths. The once novel life-saving strategy of administering Narcan has morphed into a common and accepted best practice, and

County Indiana now serves the community via vending machines in Porter County and across Indiana.





flat screen," Dr. Fitzgerald said. "The robot translates your hand movements, and it's just like having miniature versions of your hand inside the patient."

Dr. Fitzgerald said the robotic surgery system has been useful for lung cancer procedures and infections in the pleural space around the lungs. He's done biopsies and removed cysts from lungs. "Basically, anything in the chest outside the heart we can use it for," he added.

The result is that a lung cancer patient having a lobe of the lung removed can be discharged from the hospital two or three days after surgery. The average hospitalization is about five days for open surgery with a thoracotomy incision.

Lung cancer is the deadliest type of cancer, killing more people than breast, colon, and prostate cancers combined. With early detection, however, up to 90% can be cured. ## This week in history

#### **January 30,1968**

Viet Cong forces, supported by large numbers of North Vietnamese troops, launched their largest and best coordinated offensive of the war, driving into the center of South Vietnam's seven largest cities and attacking 30 provincial capitals from the Mekong Delta to the DMZ.

In Saigon, a Viet Cong suicide squad seized the U.S. Embassy and held it for six hours until an assault force of U.S. paratroopers landed by helicopter on the building's roof.

By February 10, the Tet Offensive was largely crushed, but with heavy casualties on both sides. The former imperial capital city of Hue took almost a month of house-to-house combat to regain. General Westmoreland echoed that appraisal four days later in a statement declaring that Allied forces had killed more enemy troops in the previous seven days than the United States had lost in the entire war.

Militarily, Tet was decidedly an Allied victory, but psychologically and politically, it was a disaster. The size and scope of the communist attacks caught the American public by surprise. The early reporting of a communist victory went largely uncorrected in the media. The heavy U.S. casualties incurred during the offensive, coupled with the disillusionment over the earlier optimistic reports of progress, accelerated the public's growing disenchantment with President Johnson's conduct of the Vietnam War.
